SECTION 1: The Council of the Village of South Amherst hereby approves and authorizes the Fiscal Officer to implement and pay the compensation for paid part-time members of the Village of South Amherst Police Department hereinafter set forth:

Chief of Police (not to exceed 130 hrs p/month)	\$16.17 per hour
Chief of Police Training Wage (not to exceed 130 hrs p/month)	\$16.17 per hour
Lieutenant (not to exceed 130 hrs p/month)	\$12.26 per hour
Sergeant (not to exceed 100 hrs p/month)	\$11.72 per hour
Patrol Officer (not to exceed 30 hrs of road patrol p/month).....	\$11.34 per hour

Training, court appearances and mandated meetings are not included in the above requirements and are paid separately.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance hereby repeals any and all provisions of Ordinances which are in conflict herewith.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING EXISTING SOUTH AMHERST CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 921.04 AND ENACTING NEW SOUTH AMHERST CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 921.04, EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 21, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH AMHERST, LORAIN COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: The Council of the Village of South Amherst hereby repeals existing South Amherst Codified Ordinance Section 921.04 and enacts new South Amherst Codified Ordinance Section 921.04, effective December 21, 2019, as follows:

921.04 USER FEES AND WATER RATES.

(a) The Village does hereby establish water rates for the Village of South Amherst and Board of Trustees of Public Affairs with a two percent (2%) increase each year for the next three (3) years as set forth below:

- p/first 1000 gallons/monthly minimum
- p/1000 gallons over the first 1000 gallons
- p/1000 gallons for bulk hydrant rate

(b) The Village does hereby establish user fees of \$15.00 per month. User fees shall be used for capital improvements for the Village water distribution system and shall not be applied to payment of salary, wages, and benefits of Board of Trustees of Public Affairs employees.

(c) Current rates for water usage for the minimum 1,000 gallon p/month and usage above the minimum of 1,000 gallons p/month shall remain in effect until the effective date of the new rates.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall repeal all Ordinances in conflict herewith.

SECTION 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
